# About Our Association



The South Carolina Health Care Association (SCHCA) was organized in 1955 as the statewide organization to represent member nursing homes. The association's name at that time was The South Carolina Association of Nursing Homes, Inc. The Association was chartered in October 1969 so that services to the membership could be expanded.

The association is composed of nursing homes providing professional long-term nursing care and representing approximately 18,000 nursing home beds licensed in the State of South Carolina.

In 2016 members of the Association voted to accept Assisted Living Facilities as full members of the Association.

As a professional association, the state office works closely with the General Assembly and the State and Federal agencies governing nursing home operations. The association staff coordinates state-wide programs, membership meetings, conventions, a trade show, monthly newsletter and a Buyer's Guide & Directory. The staff plans educational programs for Administrators, Nurses in Long Term Care, Activity Directors, Social Workers and other nursing home personnel.

In March, 1997 the Association formed South Carolina Health Care Services, Inc. as a service to its members and as a way to keep dues from increasing. This corporation was formed to provide group purchasing power for association members and today consists of a variety of products and services including incontinence products, wound care, food and dietary supplies, medical products and services, maintenance, office products, kitchen equipment and supplies, and capital equipment.

Our goal is to assist every member facility in providing the highest standard of patient care possible.

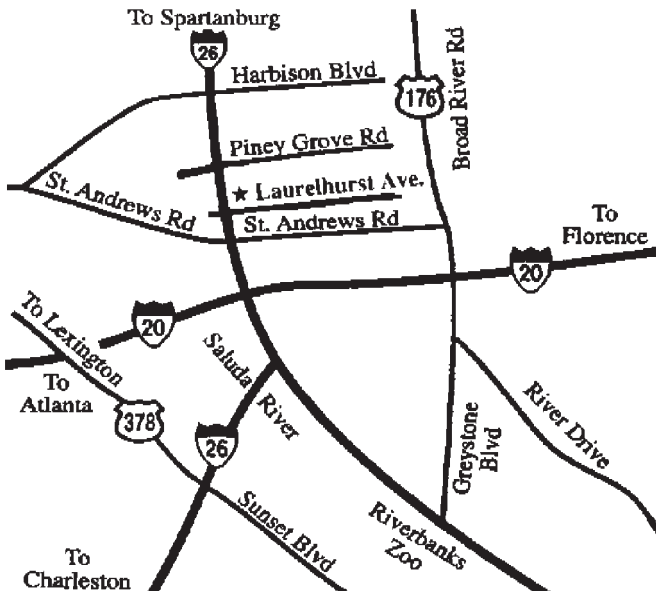

# **SOUTH CAROLINA HEALTH CARE ASSOCIATION**

## **PREAMBLE**

This Association shall be known as “The South Carolina Health Care Association”. The objectives of the Association shall be to establish and promote the general welfare through development and maintenance of high standards of care and administration in Nursing Homes, Assisted Livings and related long term care facilities in South Carolina. The Association will maintain high standards for the profession through the support of sound legislation and by the promotion of quality continuing education programs. The Constitution and By-Laws shall apply to all members of the association, regardless of membership category.

## **ARTICLE I - MEMBERSHIP**

### **Section 1. Institutional Membership**

A. Any nursing home or assisted living facility currently licensed by the state of South Carolina shall be eligible to make application for institutional membership in the Association. Provided however, an Assisted Living Facility, not Associated with a member nursing home must have a minimum of thirty licensed beds.

B. All applications for membership and all membership dues shall be handled through the Association office.

C. Notification of each new application for membership shall be made to the Executive Board. The applicant shall become an institutional member upon approval by a majority of the Board.

D. At the time the institution is accepted for membership, a designated representative of that facility shall be appointed and written communication of that appointment shall be presented to the Association. Changes shall be made by written notice to the Association.

E. No nursing home which is owned, leased or operated by a multi-facility corporation, a partnership or a proprietorship shall be elected to membership or be permitted to renew its membership in the Association unless all other nursing homes facilities in South Carolina which are owned, leased or operated by that corporation, partnership or proprietorship and which qualify for membership are members of the Association. This rule may be waived by a two-thirds vote of the Executive Board. A facility has 60 days from the date of licensing to join. New facilities may be granted up to six months to join by majority vote of the Board.

F. Member nursing homes or assisted living facilities which are owned, leased or operated by a multifacility corporation, a partnership or a proprietorship shall provide the Association with a list of authorized personnel employed at the management company who are eligible to participate in Association events for which membership is required. These persons shall be full-time employees whose duties are related to skilled nursing or Assisted Living Facilities owned or operated by the management company and not employed as consultants or are not eligible for Association membership under a different membership category. Full time employees of institutional members of the South Carolina Health Care Association are eligible to participate in all Association activities. Multifacility corporations, a partnership or a proprietorship shall provide the Association with a list of authorized personnel employed at the management company who are

eligible to participate in Association events for which membership is required. These persons shall be full-time employees whose duties are related to skilled nursing or assisted living facilities owned or operated by the management company and not employed as consultants or are not eligible for Association membership under a different membership category. Full time employees of institutional members of the South Carolina Health Care Association are eligible to participate in all Association activities.

## Section 2. Affiliate Membership

Affiliate Membership Type A shall include licensed nursing homes or assisted living facilities under construction, and in confirmed planning stages. Upon completion of the construction and upon being licensed by the appropriate state licensing agency, membership shall terminate and applicant must apply for institutional membership.

Affiliate Membership Type B shall include institutions, organizations, vendors, agencies or associations interested in promoting the objectives of the Association.

Both types of Affiliate Membership are subject to the approval of the Executive Board and to such rules and regulations as the Association Membership shall adopt, and as hereinafter provided.

### (a) Application

Application shall be made on forms to be supplied by the Association.

### (b) Acceptance

The applicant shall become an affiliate member upon majority vote of the executive board.

### (c) Representative

At the time the affiliate is accepted for membership, a designated representative of that facility shall be appointed and written communication of that appointment shall be presented to the Association. Changes shall be made by written notice to the Association.

## Section 3. Personal Membership

Personal Membership Type A shall include persons affiliated with institutions or organizations having institutional membership in the Association, including members of governing boards, members of volunteer organizations, administrative, supervisory, professional and technical personnel employed by the institution or organization.

Personal Membership Type B shall include persons not associated with an institution or organization eligible for membership but who are interested in promoting the objectives of the Association.

Both types of Personal Membership are subject to the approval of the Executive Board and to such rules and regulations as the Association Membership shall adopt and as are hereinafter provided.

(a) Applications shall not be accepted for personal membership from persons associated with facilities which are eligible for institutional membership.

(b) Applications shall be made on forms supplied by the Association.

(c) Notification of each new application for membership shall be made to the Executive Board, subject to their approval.

## Section 4. Life Membership

(a) Life Membership in the Association may be conferred by the Executive Board to a member because of outstanding service to the Association.

(b) Life members do not pay dues, do not vote, unless otherwise designated

by the Board, and cannot hold office but may, by invitation of the Chairman, act in an advisory capacity and serve on committees. Voting privileges may be granted for committee purposes.

#### Section 5. Honorary Membership

Honorary membership may be granted to persons who have rendered outstanding service to the Association, or in the field of long term care or allied professional activities.

#### Section 6. Reprimand, Suspension and Termination

##### (a) Voluntary

1. A member may voluntarily withdraw from membership in the Association.
2. Upon voluntary termination dues shall not be refunded.

##### (b) Involuntary

1. Complaints and Grievances against a member of the Association may be brought by a facility member, authorized representative of a facility member or the Executive Board by majority vote. All complaints shall be made in writing to the Chairman of the Executive Board and to the President of the Association. Complaints made by an individual or by a member facility shall be signed by the individual or by an authorized representative of the facility provided all persons are on record with the Association. Complaints made by majority vote of the Executive Board shall be signed by the Chairman.

2. All complaints shall be brought to the attention of the Executive Board within fifteen (15) days of receipt by the Chairman and President, except complaints made by the Executive Board, which notice is not necessary. The Executive Board shall determine whether or not the complaint has merit. If the Board so determines, they shall immediately elect a special Committee of not less than three members of the Executive Board to investigate the complaint and to make determinations and recommendations to the Executive Board.

3. The Committee shall first elect a Chairman. Upon election, the Chairman shall, within thirty days (30) after receipt of the complaint, provide the accused member with written notice of the charges against him or her. The notice shall inform the accused member of the nature of the charges and shall request a written or oral explanation of the charges within fifteen (15) days of receipt of the notification from the Association.

4. If the accused explains his or her conduct or takes action that the Committee deems to be satisfactory, the Committee may choose to take no further action and shall report their findings to the Executive Board. However, if the accused fails to respond or does not provide the Committee with a satisfactory response within the time prescribed, the Committee, through the Chairman, shall provide the accused and the Executive Board with written notice of a date and time and place for a hearing on the charges. If practical, hearings should be held at the Association offices. Accused parties are allowed to bring witnesses or relevant information to the hearing provided a witness list and a copy of the information to be presented is provided to the Committee at least five business days prior to the hearing. The Chairman shall conduct the proceedings and shall have final determination on evidence and approval of witnesses. Hearings shall be conducted in an impartial manner. Judicial rules of evidence need not be followed. Attorneys shall not be allowed in the hearing to represent either party. The Committee shall render a decision within ten (10) days of the conclusion of the hearing.

5. The written decision or recommendation of the majority of the Committee shall immediately be made available to the Executive Board and each of the

parties of the hearing. The Committee, within its discretion may recommend dismissal of the complaint, private or public reprimand of the accused, suspension of the membership for a definite period of time or termination of the membership.

6. The Executive Board will have final determination over all decisions. The Board will make a final determination within thirty (30) days of receipt of the Committee's findings. The Executive Board may dismiss the complaint, shall have the power, by majority vote, to impose reasonable conditions of suspension or reprimand or terminate the membership or take such other action as the Board deems appropriate. Such conditions may include but are not limited to apology or reprimand. Failure to comply with the conditions imposed shall be sufficient grounds for expulsion, suspension or reprimand as the Executive Board may deem appropriate. Upon expulsion or suspension dues shall not be refunded.

7. Upon written petition for reinstatement, the Executive Board shall have the power, by majority vote, to reinstate an expelled or suspended member. The Board shall have the power to impose reasonable conditions for reinstatement. Failure to comply with the conditions of reinstatement shall be sufficient grounds for expulsion, suspension or reprimand as the Board may deem just by majority vote.

8. Grounds for expulsion, suspension or reprimand include but are not limited to the following:

(a) Non-payment of dues within the time specified as the delinquent date in these Bylaws;

(b) Willful infraction of the Current Rules and Bylaws of the Association;

(c) Acts or conduct deemed disorderly, injurious or hostile to the interests or objectives of the Association;

(d) The willful improper operation of a facility or management company

#### Section 7. Transfer of Membership

Any members, institutional, affiliate or personal, may transfer from one type of membership to another after proper notification has been made in writing to the Executive Board, provided the requirements for the new type of membership are met in full, except that Type A personal members transferring from a member institution to a non-member institution may continue membership Type B personal member.

#### Section 8. Associate Membership

(a) Membership shall be composed of personnel of institutional members of the Association. Membership terminates upon termination of a valid employee relationship with a member institution. Termination of employment shall terminate membership in this section.

(b) Section Names. The name of the section may designate the discipline of the function of the personnel who are members; i.e. Social Service Section, Activities Section, Long Term Care Nurses Section, Certified Nursing Assistants Section, etc.

(c) Membership dues shall be determined by the Executive Board and shall be submitted to the Association for accountability through the accounts of the Association.

(d) Each Section should meet at least once annually. Meetings should include educational programs appropriate to the Section's designated interest. Credentialing of educational programs and workshops must be obtained when appropriate. Instructors and/or workshop leaders for non-credentialed programs must meet the professional standards of the Association.

(e) Transfer of membership dues may be applied for in the event of termination of employment and the employment of another person only upon application for such change by the member institution.

(f) The Executive Committee may appoint a counselor to serve as an advisor to each personal membership section. The counselor shall serve as a liaison between the Section and the Executive Committee officer designated as responsible for this Association activity.

#### Section 9. Liaison Officer

The immediate Past Chairman of the Association shall serve as Liaison Officer between each personal membership section and the Executive Board; or in the event the Immediate Past Chairman fails to act or qualify, the Executive Board shall appoint a Liaison Officer to act in his stead. It shall be the responsibility of the Liaison Officer to provide a ready channel of communication between the Executive Board and each section through which suggestions and requests can be transmitted and explained.

### ARTICLE II - DUES AND ASSESSMENTS

#### Section 1. Annual Dues

The annual dues for institutional, affiliate and personal memberships shall be determined by a majority vote of the members of the Association Membership present and voting at the annual meeting and shall remain in effect until changed as provided in this Article. Dues for Assisted Living facilities shall be \$ 15.00 for each of its licensed beds.

#### Section 2. Changes in Dues

The Budget and Finance Committee, with the approval of the Executive Board, shall recommend to the Association Membership changes in the annual dues structure, with reasons therefore and the effect upon the income of the Association. Dues established by the Association Membership shall become effective at the beginning of the ensuing fiscal year. However, if the Executive Board votes to increase annual dues or levy a special dues assessment, the Executive Board may change the dues structure during the fiscal year, subject to approval by the Association membership at their next meeting. Dues agreements shall be mailed after approval of the budget by the membership and facilities are required to return them prior to January 1. Dues agreements shall constitute a valid contract.

#### Section 3. Life and Honorary Membership Dues

Life and Honorary Membership shall be exempt from the payment of dues.

#### Section 4. American Health Care Association

The Association shall be responsible for the collection of dues for membership in the American Health Care Association in accordance with the dues as determined by the American Health Care Association, concurrently with the State Association dues. Provided, however, this section shall be null and void if SCHCA is not affiliated with the American Health Care Association.

#### Section 5. Payment of Dues

The annual dues shall be due and payable for the ensuing fiscal year, as determined by the Budget and Finance Committee and approved by the Executive Board. Optional methods of payment of dues may be approved by

the Executive Board and the Budget and Finance Committee as defined in subsection (d) of this article.

(a) Facilities newly admitted to membership, other than the first month of the fiscal year, shall pay annual dues on a prorated basis computed from the first day of the month in which certification of membership was effective in the Association. New Facilities that have been approved by the Board of Directors have thirty (30) days from notification of approval to pay dues as specified on the contract agreement signed with the South Carolina Health Care Association. The designated delegate or alternate as recorded with the South Carolina Health Care Association may vote upon payment of dues in accordance with the contract agreement with the South Carolina Health Care Association.

(b) Trade Associate members elected to membership shall pay dues and booth fee prior to the annual trade show and convention.

(c) Facility associate members, Basic Associate and Personal members elected to membership shall pay dues according to the following schedule:

(1) Persons approved for facility associate, basic associate, or personal membership during the first six months of the fiscal year shall pay dues for the full year;

(2) Persons approved for facility associate, basic associate, or personal membership the seventh through eleventh month shall pay prorated dues based on the number of months remaining in the fiscal year.

(3) Persons approved for facility associate, basic associate, or personal membership the twelfth month shall pay no dues but shall be billed for a full year the first of the next fiscal year.

(d) Membership renewals and annual dues shall be effective on the first day of the first month of the Association's fiscal year. Agreements for renewal must be forwarded to the Association by December 31 of the previous year. Renewal members shall be defined as any member who has been a member at any time within the immediate previous twelve months who has submitted a dues agreement or paid dues by December 31 of the previous year. Before members shall be eligible for membership renewal, all accrued delinquent dues must be paid in full.

(e) The Budget and Finance Committee shall annually recommend to the Board an installment method for the payment of dues. The Committee may recommend a plan of monthly installments not to exceed six payments with all payments due by June 15th of each year. The Board may develop individual plans for facilities on a case by case basis for good cause such as extreme hardship or failure to meet previous payment deadlines. Installment plans shall be submitted with the proposed budget for Board approval.

(f) If dues are not paid within sixty (60) days of the date on which they become due and payable by members paying on annual basis, or thirty (30) days after an installment is due and payable by members on an approved installment system, the Treasurer shall notify each member in arrears, and if such dues are not paid within thirty (30) days after notice is mailed, membership shall be terminated. Upon two-thirds vote by the Executive Board, this provision may be waived. The Board shall have the authority to place restrictions on the membership until such time as all dues are paid in full. This shall apply to any facility that is substantially owned by the same individuals. A member whose membership has been terminated for non-payment of dues may be reinstated to membership upon payment of all dues in default and payable at the time an application is made. Reinstatement to membership shall be subject to the same criteria of new membership established by the Membership and Ethics

Committee standards.

(g) Installment System - The Budget and Finance Committee may approve an installment payment system, upon voluntary application by an institutional member, pursuant to Section 5 (d) of this Article subject to the following provisions:

The institutional member must execute a written and binding agreement with the Association that during each fiscal year an installment payment system is in effect, the institutional member will be liable for the payment to the Association of the full annual dues.

### ARTICLE III - AFFILIATION

#### Section 1. American Health Care Association

The South Carolina Health Care Association may be affiliated with and participate fully in the activities of the American Health Care Association and the National Center for Assisted Living as set forth in the provisions of Affiliation of the Constitution and Bylaws of the American Health Care Association. Delegates and Governing Council shall be elected by the Association Membership in accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws of the American Health Care Association and the South Carolina Health Care Association. Membership in both organizations is required of all institutional members in good standing. Provided, however, this section shall be null and void if SCHCA is not affiliated with the American Health Care Association.

### ARTICLE IV - ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP

#### Section 1. Composition

The official membership of the Association shall be composed of the authorized representatives of the institutional members in good standing.

#### Section 2. Duties and Powers

The control and administration of the Association shall vest in the Association Membership. The Association Membership shall elect the officers of the Association.

#### Section 3. Meetings

##### (a) Regular Meetings

There shall be two regular meetings of the Association Membership during a year.

##### (b) Special Meetings

Special Meetings of the Association Membership may be called by the Executive Board or, upon the written request of not less than one-third (1/3) of the voting representatives or institutional members, the Chairman shall be required to call a special meeting of the Association Membership.

##### (c) Chairman

The Chairman of the Association, or in his absence the Chairman-Elect of the Association, or such person by the direction of the Association, shall preside at meetings of the Association Membership.

##### (d) Official Action

An action of the Association Membership shall be considered official when it receives a majority of the votes of the institutional members present and voting, provided there is a quorum present as defined by Article IV, Section 5, of this Constitution, except as otherwise provided.

Section 4. Notice of Meeting

Not less than ten (10) days notice by mail of all meetings, both regular and special, of the Association Membership, shall be required. Written notices of special meetings shall specify the object of the meeting and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting. Written notice may be transmitted electronically.

Section 5. Quorum

At any regularly scheduled meeting or a special meeting held with proper notice, one-third (1/3) of the official membership shall constitute a quorum.

Section 6. Voting

The official representative shall be a designated delegate or alternate as recorded on record at the South Carolina Health Care Association. Facilities are responsible for notifying the Association of their authorized representatives. In order to have voting privileges, facility dues must be current in accordance with the contract signed with the South Carolina Health Care Association. Payment of delinquent dues must be recorded ten days before membership meetings. Voting privileges will be suspended if dues are not current. (See Article II.)

The official representative of each institutional member shall be entitled to one vote per each 21 beds or fraction thereof of paid dues membership, minimum membership shall be based on 21 beds.

Section 7. Proxy

Voting by proxy shall be permitted, provided:

(a) The person voting the proxy is a duly appointed representative of an institutional member;

(b) The proxy giving authorization is submitted in writing or email from either the designated delegate or designated alternate as recorded at the South Carolina Health Care Association to the Association before the call-to-order of the first business meeting of the Association Membership; and

(c) The proxy giving authorization states the date of the meeting on which the proxy is to be exercised.

### Section 8. Privity of Floor

Any representative of an institutional member shall be accorded the privilege of the floor on any issue before the Association membership and only institutional members in good standing shall have the right and privilege to make motions and vote.

### Section 9. Election of Officers

The Association shall elect a Chairman, Chairman-Elect, two Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and Seven Directors at Large. The duly elected officers shall take office immediately following the election held at the last semi-annual meeting of the year. Nominations shall be the first order of business on the first day at the last semi-annual meeting. The first report of the Nominating Committee shall be the first order of business after adoption of the official agenda on convening the Association Membership at the last semi-annual meeting. Nominations and seconds may then be made from the floor of the Association Membership. Each nominee for office shall then be permitted to personally present to the Association Membership a five minute resume of his or her programs and policies. Immediately prior to the elections, the Chairman of the Nominating Committee shall again present the Committee report, and the elections shall be conducted as specified in the meeting's adopted rules or order. Upon election, the duly elected officers shall immediately become members of the Executive Board without vote until duly installed.

## ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

### Section 1. Officers of the Association

The officers of the Association shall be all members of the Executive Board.

### Section 2. Eligibility

A person must be an authorized representative of an institutional member at all times to be eligible to serve as an officer of the Association. Should an officer of the Association at any time not be employed by an institutional member or not be an authorized representative of an institutional member, the office which they hold is deemed to be vacated immediately. Should the office of Past President become vacant, the most recent Past President who is an authorized representative of a member in good standing shall assume the office of Past President. Should that person already be an officer of the Association, they shall immediately resign their current position and assume the office of Past President. The office which they previously held shall be filled in the manner prescribed herein. Dues must be current in order to serve as a board member or on a committee of the South Carolina Health Care Association.

### Section 3. Term

The term of office for all offices except the appointed member(s) to the Board shall be for (1) one year or until the successor is duly elected by the Association membership at a regular semi-annual meeting. The term for the appointed board members shall expire at the opening of the annual meeting. The Chairman, Chairman-Elect, the Secretary, and the Treasurer shall not serve more than three consecutive one year terms in that office, but shall not be precluded from election to another office after the completion of their term.

## Section 4. Duties

### (a) Chairman

The Chairman shall direct the affairs of the Association as its Administrative Officer; shall serve as a member of the AHCA Council of States and shall, with the approval of the Executive Board, appoint the Chairman and members of each standing Committee, except the Nominating Committee, Budget and Finance Committee, and shall serve as a member of all committees, and shall make a report to the Association membership at the annual and semiannual meetings. The Chairman and members of Special and Ad Hoc Committees may be appointed by the Chairman from time to time to serve the needs of the Association. The Chairman shall serve as Chairman of all General Assembly meetings and Executive Board Meetings; and shall perform all other duties and responsibilities attributed to the office of Chairman in the Constitution.

The Chairman shall serve as a member of the Council of States of the American Health Care Association, shall also serve as a liaison officer between the American Health Care Association and the South Carolina Health Care Association, shall inform the membership through the Executive Board of all important matters coming from the American Health Care Association; and, shall issue a report to the Association Membership at the annual and semi-annual meetings. The Association President shall serve as alternate to NCAL.

### (b) Chairman-Elect

The Chairman-Elect shall assist the Chairman in the performance of duties, and in the absence of the Chairman, shall act in his stead at all meetings of the Association.

### (c) Vice Chairman

The First Vice Chairman shall assist the Chairman and the Chairman-Elect in the performance of their duties when it shall be deemed appropriate, and shall present all applications for membership to the Executive Board.

### (d) Vice Chairman

The Second Vice Chairman shall assist the Chairman, Chairman-Elect and Vice Chairman in the performance of their duties and responsibilities. The Vice Chairman shall report all professional liaison activities to the Executive Board for action and referral for proper use.

### (e) Secretary

The Secretary shall be responsible for assuring that all records of the Association meetings, the Executive Board meetings, and the membership roll and such other formal reports as is appropriate are maintained, for the posting of all meetings in accordance with the procedures set forth in the Constitution, for the transmittal of recorded minutes to all officers of the Executive Board and the Membership of the Association, receive the reports of Committee for proper referral to officers; the Executive Board, and the Association Membership.

### (f) Treasurer

The Treasurer shall serve as the Chairman of the Budget and Finance Committee, shall be responsible for carrying out all fiscal policies and procedures adopted by the Executive Board and/or the Association Membership; and shall be responsible together with the President for the preparation of financial statements in reasonable detail and presentation of the same to the Executive Board and the Association Membership.

### (g) Seven Director-At-Large Positions

The Association shall elect seven Directors at Large. These persons shall serve as members of the Executive Board and may serve as chairpersons of committees if so designated by the Chairman.

## Section 5. Vacancies

Should a vacancy occur in the office of the Chairman, the Chairman-Elect shall succeed to the office of the Chairman and shall continue to serve for the term for which the Chairman was regularly elected. In the event of vacancies of office of other officers of the Association, the appointment may be made by the Executive Board for the balance of the term of office so vacated, subject to the approval of the Association Membership upon its next regular meeting.

## ARTICLE VI - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

### Section 1. Order of Business

The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order (newly revised edition) shall govern the order and conduct of business at all meetings of the Executive Board and of the Association Membership in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the Association's Constitution and any special rules of order the Association may adopt.

### Section 2. Parliamentarian

The Chairman may designate a Parliamentarian, whose duties shall be to advise the membership, the officers, the Executive Board, Committee Chairman, and the Committee members, with respect to all parliamentary matters that may arise during a regular Association Membership meeting. The Parliamentarian may preside over any or all portions of the meeting for which his or her services are obtained provided the Association Membership, by proper motion, approve that he or she shall preside.

## ARTICLE VII - FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Association shall be January 1 through December 31.

## ARTICLE VIII - EXECUTIVE BOARD

### Section 1. Composition

The Executive Board shall consist of the Chairman, Chairman-Elect, two Vice Chairmen, Secretary, the Treasurer, Six Directors at Large, the Chairman of the Hospital Related/Non-profit Conference, the immediate Past Chairman and one member appointed by the Board. The appointed member shall be elected by majority vote of the Board

### Section 2. Powers and Duties

The Executive Board shall be charged with the responsibilities and management of the business of the Association, and the implementation of the policies and purpose of this Association between meetings of the Association Membership provided their actions are not inconsistent with the Constitution of the Association or actions taken by the Association Membership. The Executive Board shall report all actions and decisions to the Association Membership at the next general session for ratification or in writing when necessary to implement the programs of the Association. This may be done by submission of written minutes to the Association Membership.

The Executive Board shall be responsible for the functions of the Committees of the Association to determine that the purposes and objectives of the Association as provided for in the Constitution are carried out. The Executive

Board shall be responsible for the custody and management of all property and funds of the Association, shall cause the financial records of the Association to be audited at least annually, and shall cause all officers and employees who are charged with the receipt, custody or disbursement of funds of the Association to be bonded. The Executive Board shall render reports to the members of the Association membership and shall sit as a referral committee to which all proposed changes in the Constitution must be submitted before presentation to the Association Membership, and it shall have the duty, responsibility, and the power to fill any vacancies created by the resignation or otherwise inability to serve as officers or members of the Executive Board unless the filling of the vacancy is otherwise provided for in the Constitution. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the operation of the financial affairs of the Association within the budget adopted by the Association Membership, and shall not authorize, incur or obligate the Association for expenditures in excess of ten percent of the annual budget without prior authority from the Association Membership, except as provided for in the approved budget.

The Executive Board shall be responsible for the establishment, management and operation of a centrally located Association office in accordance with the mandates of the Association Membership.

The Executive Board shall be responsible for the appointment of official representatives of the Association to appropriate boards and committees of official agencies and organizations.

### Section 3. Voting

Each member of the Executive Board shall have one vote each while the Executive Board is in session and discharging the duties and functions of the Executive Board.

### Section 4. Proxy

Voting by proxy shall not be permitted.

### Section 5. Meetings

Meetings of the Executive Board may be called by the Chairman, or in the event of his inability to serve the Chairman-Elect, or by any three members of the Executive Board in writing, except that not less than one meeting shall be held in each calendar quarter. The Chairman, or in his absence, the Chairman-Elect, or the First Vice Chairman, in that order, shall preside at meetings of the Executive Board.

An action of the Executive Board shall be considered official when it receives a majority of votes of the members present and voting, provided there is a quorum present. Mail or electronic votes by members of the Executive Board shall be permitted. However, mail votes received after the vote shall not alter the outcome of any action taken by the Board and shall be recorded only as to how the member would have voted had they been present.

### Section 6. Notice of Meetings

Not less than (3) three days' notice by mail, email, or facsimile of meetings of the Executive Board shall be required except for the regularly scheduled meetings in which case ten (10) days' notice shall be given. All telephone notices of meetings shall be confirmed by mail or email immediately. All notices of special meetings shall specify the object of the meeting and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting. The time and date for meetings shall be set by the Executive Board.

### Section 7. Quorum

Fifty percent (50%) of the elected membership of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum.

### Section 8. Absence

Any member of the Executive Board who shall be absent from three consecutive meetings of the Executive Board without justifiable cause, as determined by the Board, shall be required to resign. The Board must ascertain that said member has been properly notified of all meetings and that said meetings have been called in reasonable accessible locations and at reasonable times under reasonable circumstances.

### Section 9. Reports and Committee Reports

It shall be the duty and responsibility of the Executive Board to receive reports from Committees of the Association. The Committee reports shall not vest power of vote upon the member so reporting should that person not be an elected member of the Executive Board.

No non-member of the Executive Board shall have the privilege of making motion, participating in discussion after a motion is made, or voting at any meeting of the Executive Board. No member or non-member serving in an advisory capacity to the Association, to the Executive Board or to a committee of the Association shall assume or be given the privilege of disclosing the official business of the Association to any other member or non-member of the Association unless so authorized by the Association or the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall exercise control of the publication of Executive Board business to determine that non-members are not entrusted with or clothed with rights or powers to speak for the Executive Board or the Association Membership, except that a non-member may be the appointed President or Legal Advisor whose relationship to the Board or committee has been defined to the Association Membership and approved by the Executive Board.

### Section 10. Executive Committee

The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chairman, Chairman-Elect, the Secretary, the Treasurer and one member of the Executive Board, appointed by the Chairman.

### Section 11. President

The Executive Board shall employ a President whose responsibility shall be the day to day management of the Association. The Executive Board shall clearly delineate the duties, responsibilities and authority of the President. Employment of the President shall be the sole responsibility of the Executive Board and may not be delegated.

## ARTICLE IX- COMMITTEES

### Section 1. Committee Membership

(a) Chairmen and voting members of all committees and subcommittees shall be designated representatives of Institutional members in good standing with the Association at the time of their appointments, and shall remain so during their terms of service.

(b) Chairmen and members of committees shall be appointed by the Chairman, subject to the approval of the Executive Board, except as otherwise

herein provided.

(c) Vacancies occurring mid-term shall be filled by appointment of the Chairman, subject to the approval of the Executive Board. The appointees shall serve the remainder of the original appointees' terms.

## Section 2. Functions of Committees

Standing and special committees shall be established from time to time as deemed necessary to assist the Executive Board and Association Membership to implementing the program, organizational, administrative, and financial objectives of the Association. Committees shall function in a developmental and advisory capacity, recommending programs and policies in the major areas of Association interest to which they are assigned. Each committee shall endeavor to cooperate with other committees and other organizations interested in its areas of activity. Assisted Living facility members shall have an opportunity for representation on each standing committee of the Association except the Performance Evaluation committee.

## Section 3. Standing Committee

There shall be the following standing committees: Budget and Finance, Constitution, Convention, Payment for Services, DHEC Advisory, Quality, and Education.

### (a) Budget and Finance Committee

The Budget and Finance Committee shall be concerned with all organizational matters of a financial nature, including, but not limited to, preparation of an annual budget, recommendations or resolutions adopting the expenditure of monies.

### (b) Constitution Committee

The Constitution Committee shall be concerned with all matters relating to Association incorporation, constitution, regulations, resolutions, together with those concerning credential certification and rules of permanent organization of the annual meeting or any meeting of the membership or other subordinate bodies of the Association.

### (c) Payment for Services

The Payment for Services Committee shall be concerned with all matters relating to reimbursement for services from Medicare, Medicaid, and other sources.

### (d) Convention Committee

The Convention Committee shall be concerned with all matters relating to the planning for the annual convention and trade show.

### (e) Education Committee

The Education Committee shall be concerned with all matters relating to Education appropriate to the needs of the Association Membership. The Education Committee shall assist staff in recommending programs for the membership.

### (f) Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee shall consist of the immediate Past Chairman, who shall serve as Chairman, the two Past Chairman prior to the immediate Past Chairman if they are members in good standing of the Association, and three members at-large, two appointed by the Chairman and one appointed by the Executive Board. The nominating committee shall present to the membership candidates for all elected positions except Immediate Past-Chairman. The committee may present more than one name for each office.

### (g) Performance Evaluation Committee

The Performance Evaluation Committee will evaluate the performance of the

President. The Committee shall consist of the Chairman, who shall serve as chairman, the Chairman-Elect, the Chairman of the Payment for Services Committee, the Chairman of the DHEC Advisory Committee and one member appointed by majority vote of the Executive Board.

(h) DHEC Advisory Committee

The DHEC Advisory Committee shall be concerned by all regulatory matters administered by the Department of Health and Environmental Control and CMS

#### Section 4. Special and Ad Hoc Committees

Special and Ad Hoc Committees may be appointed by the Chairman with the approval of the Executive Board and/or the Association Membership as deemed necessary. Such Committees shall be charged with specific tasks, which do not fall within the assigned functions of existing standing committees, and these committees shall cease to exist upon presentation of their final reports to the appointing body.

#### Section 5. Subcommittees of Standing Committees

Each Committee may establish, subject to approval of the Chairman of the Board, subcommittees as may be deemed necessary to carry forward the work of the committees. Appointment of any additional members of a sub-committee shall be at the discretion of the Board Chairman.

#### Section 6. Meetings

Each Committee shall meet at least once annually or more often at the direction of the Chairman or the President.

#### Section 7. Voting Quorum and Proxy

Each member of a committee shall have one vote in any matter presented for vote. A majority of the members of the committee shall constitute a quorum. Proxy voting shall not be permitted.

#### Section 8. Authority of Committees

Committees, in called meetings, shall be authorized to consider any matters pertinent to their prescribed areas of concern or changes as defined in Section 2 of this Article, and to recommend that other committees, by virtue of their particular area of activity, consider referred items of mutual concern. Committees shall not be authorized to secure nor attempt to secure funds independently from sources outside the Association. No committee nor any representative thereof shall represent the Association before any legislative, judicial, or executive tribunal in any proceedings or matters unless specifically designated to do so by the Chairman or President of the Association, and in the event of such request, such representation shall be limited to furtherance of duly authorized actions and policies of the Association.

#### Section 9. Reports

(a) All reports, recommendations, or other actions of committees, shall be reported to the Executive Board.

#### Section 10. Joint Commission

When a matter concerns more than one committee and thus requires mutual consideration, a joint meeting of such committees, or subcommittees thereof,

may be called subject.

The Chairman of such a joint committee shall be selected by the Chairman of the Association.

#### Section 11. Committee Consultants

Consultants may be appointed to serve, without vote, on committees of the Association. Any such appointments shall be made by the Executive Board upon nomination by the Chairman and recommendation of committee chairman.

### ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS

#### Section 1. Initiating Amendments

(a) Proposals for amendments to the Constitution may be initiated by the Executive Board, Constitution Committee, or by petition of any institutional member following the procedure in Section 2 herein. Proposed amendments to the Constitution not receiving favorable recommendation from the Constitution Committee shall not be included in the Committee report to the Association Membership, except upon written request of the proponent, received by certified mail, at the Association Office at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting of the Association membership.

(b) Amendments to the Constitution may be proposed from the floor at any meeting of the Association membership. However, amendments proposed in this manner shall not be acted upon until the next following meeting and following the procedure specified in Section 2 herein. (Provided the thirty-day notice has been met.)

#### Section 2. Procedure

(a) Each proposed amendment shall be submitted, in writing, by certified mail, to the Secretary and the President of the Association and shall be referred by the Executive Board to the Constitution Committee for study and recommendation, except amendments proposed by the Constitution and Bylaws Committee.

(b) Proposed amendments and recommendations shall be filed with the Secretary and President by the proponent at least (30) days prior to the meeting at which such amendments are to be considered.

#### Section 3. Adoption

Amendments to the Constitution presented as specified in Section 2 of this Article, may be adopted at any semi-annual meeting of the Association Membership upon receiving affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the institutional members present and voting. Constitutional amendments so adopted shall become effective immediately.

### ARTICLE XI - DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

Awards for distinguished service, in whatever form such as the Better Life Award, may be made by the Association to any individual, firm or corporation upon approval of the Executive Board.

## ARTICLE XII - DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution or other termination of this Association, the last Executive Board may be empowered by the Association Membership to distribute all remaining funds and/or property of the Association to its successors or to other charitable or tax-exempt organizations. No dissolution act or actions shall be taken without the consent in writing of three fourths (3/4) of the entire voting membership of this Association. All financial obligations of the Association must be satisfied before any dissolution may take place.
